PENNE ALLA VODKA

Vodka may seem like an odd ingredient for an Italian dish, but this Florentine pasta has become a modern classic. When cooking with a strong liquor such as vodka or brandy, it is important to add it early on in the cooking so that most of the alcohol and its harsh taste can evaporate, leaving behind only the flavor of the liquor. For a tomato-based sauce like this one, add the liquor after sautéing the garlic and allow it to reduce before putting the tomatoes in the pan.

When adding liquor to a pan, be sure to completely remove the pan from the stovetop to prevent possible flare-ups. Keep a lid handy in case you need to smother any flames.

Ingredients:

- 5 large tomatoes
- 1/3 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 garlic cloves, very thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup vodka
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- Pinch of red pepper flakes
- 1 lb. penne
- 1/2 cup heavy cream
- Leaves from 3 or 4 large fresh flat-leaf parsley sprigs, coarsely chopped

Directions:

Peel and seed the tomatoes, then cut them into small dice. If the tomatoes are very juicy, drain them for about 10 minutes in a colander. Set aside.

In a large fry pan over medium heat, warm the olive oil. Add the garlic and sauté until just starting to turn golden, 1 to 2 minutes. Remove the pan from the stovetop and add the vodka. Return the pan to medium heat and cook until reduced by half. Add the tomatoes, salt, black pepper and red pepper flakes and simmer, uncovered, for 10 minutes.

Meanwhile, bring a large pot of water to a boil over high heat. Generously salt the boiling water, add the pasta and cook until al dente (tender but firm to the bite), 10 to 12 minutes. Drain well and add the pasta to the fry pan.

Add the cream and cook, stirring, over medium heat until the pasta is well coated with the sauce, about 2 minutes. Taste and adjust the seasonings. Pour into a warmed large, shallow bowl. Add the parsley and toss briefly. Serve immediately.

Serves 4.

ROBERT'S REMEDIES By Robert Grant

Greetings fellow Mustang enthusiasts:

Three technical things I learned this year:

- 1. Kim and my '91 Town Car has analog odometers. After two trips to the wrecking yard to fix the broken gears I found the four gears for less than \$100 from Southern Electric, I found on the Internet. These gears are high quality, polymer, unlike the garbage plastic they replaced.
- 2. Now this is unscientific, but I have rehydrated my Optima batteries by popping off the two disks on top of the battery and using a 20 cc syringe I added about 80 ccs of distilled water. After the spiral cells absorbed this water, I repeated this process for one of the bad batteries. I was able to revive usage of all three batteries that were dead.
- 3. Unable to start Kim's '70 'Stang after determining fuel and ignition were present, I jumped positive from the battery to the positive terminal of the coil. The 351 started immediately and when idling sufficiently, I removed the jumper. The car ran great while warm. When allowed to cool down this process needed to be repeated. Maybe I need to address the resistor between the ignition and coil. I only have six volts at the coil with the Petronix module (Petronix replaced points.)

PUMPED UP PONY

If you're curious about what the 2010 Ford Mustang will look like when it debuts next April it's new running horse badge may offer a clue. Like the upcoming restyled Mustang, the new pony is more refined and more muscular.

A stronger, more dynamic pony badge with defined edges and crisper forms on a subtly toned, tinted-chrome finish will charge across the grills of the V-6 and GT versions of the 2010 Mustang. For the first time a black chrome version of the Mustang pony badge will be available on the new GT grill.

"We wanted to give the Mustang pony a more realistic feel," said Douglas Gaffka, chief designer for the 2010 Mustang. "We lifted the head to make the pony more proud and tipped the neck into the wind to give it a feeling of greater speed and better balance. It's more chiseled and defined and more realistic in terms of proportion to an actual Mustang."

Like the Mustang itself, the Mustang emblem has a proud heritage. The original logo was drawn by Phil Clark for the Mustang I. It was refined for the Mustang II in 1974 by Charles Keresztes, a former member of Hungary's Olympic equestrian team. The pony continued on the front grill through 1978 but was replaced by a Ford emblem through 1993. The running horse returned in 1994 with some refinements and was updated again in 2005.

I'll move on to what we did.






