

# Greek Spinach-Pasta Salad with Feta



Prep: 10 minCook Time: 10 minServing: 6 Servings

# Ingredients

- 1 6-ounce package fresh baby spinach
- 1 15-ounce can Great Northern beans, rinsed and drained
- · 4 ounce crumbled feta cheese
- 1/4 cup dried tomatoes (not oil-packed), snipped
- · 2 green onions, chopped
- · 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 teaspoon finely shredded lemon peel
- · 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- · 4 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- · 1 tablespoon snipped fresh oregano
- · 1 tablespoon snipped fresh lemon thyme or thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon sea salt
- · 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 12 ounces dried cavatappi or farfalle pasta
- · Shaved Parmesan or Pecorino Romano cheese to top

# **Directions**

- 1. Place the spinach, beans, cheese, tomatoes, green onions, garlic, lemon peel and juice, 3 tablespoons oil, oregano, thyme, salt, and pepper in a large salad bowl, and toss to combine.
- 2. Prepare the pasta according to package directions, drain and then drizzle with the remaining 1 tablespoon of oil. Toss to coat and then transfer the pasta to the salad bowl.
- 3. Sprinkle the salad with additional salt and pepper to taste, toss once more and then serve topped with shaved Parmesan.



# **CVMC Does Forestiere Undergrounds Gardens**

On Sunday, August 12th, 27 family members of CVMC gathered at the old Mervyn's at 12:30 PM to line up to drive to Al's Café on W. Olive at 1:00 PM. They had set aside a long area by the window for us, and our waitress, Sandy, was great. You know we are not always the easiest group to wait on, but she did it with humor and efficiency. If you have never eaten there, I recommend a visit.

Our tour at the underground gardens was scheduled for 3:30 PM and we were not able to stretch our lunch out long enough to go directly there, so we split up and did various things until we met again at the gardens. It was a hot and humid day (104), and even sprinkled a little bit.

The gardens were originally purchased by Baldassare Forestiere, a Sicilian immigrant, about 1906 to grow oranges, but the ground was so hard (hardpan) that it was impossible, so he decided to hand excavate an underground retreat for himself to live in, based on the ancient catacombs, and later expanded with plans to have a lodge where others could stay to get away from the summer heat. He experimented with oranges and other fruit trees and vines, planting them underground and having them grow up through "skylights" in the rock ceilings. In the winter and rainy season he would cover the skylights with glass. He died in 1946 at age 67.

As we walked down through the tunnels, it got a little cooler the farther down we went. At the lowest point, the temperature was in the 70s. There are lots of arches and tunnel ways that lead from room to room.

At one point he had excavated enough to have 50 rooms, an area large enough to reach where Highway 99 is now, but after his death, some of the property was sold and filled in. It is currently owned by his brother's son and his children, and all the tour fees help to pay for the tour guides and maintain the property.

It was surprising the number of Fresno people who have lived here for years that had never been there. It's a California Registered Historical Landmark, and now there are 27 of us who can say that we've been there.

# Pebble Beach: Ford unveils Shelby Cobra with a monster 850-horsepower engine

The one-of-a-kind 2013 Ford Shelby GT500 Cobra is a tribute to car designer Carroll Shelby

Not far from the eye-catching vintage sports cars and immense luxury rides making up the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance car show, the auto company that bears the name of industry icon Carroll Shelby unleashed a monster.

Well, unleashed a Cobra, to be precise.

Shelby American Inc. and Ford Motor Co. unveiled a one-of-a-kind 2013 Ford Shelby GT500 Cobra that kicks out a staggering 850-horsepower at Monterey Motorsports Reunion at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca.

Decked out in the guardsman blue paint with Wimbledon white racing stripes that graced so many of the Cobra roadsters built in the 1960s, the new car is a tribute to Carroll Shelby, who died in May at the age of 89.

"Carroll Shelby changed the performance world forever," Shelby American President John Luft said in a statement. "And while he was proud of Shelby American's achievements, Carroll was far more interested in the next car we build. You will find the spirit and influence of Carroll Shelby in every future vehicle we build as found in the rear wide-body kit and hood that has been integrated into the 2013 Shelby GT500 Cobra."

Already stocked with a rowdy 662-horsepower engine, the 2013 Shelby GT500 Cobra got a boost from a Ford Racing 4.0-liter Whipple supercharger. For traction, the car features 13-inch-wide rear wheels.

Times Auto Critic David Undercoffler plans to drive it in October and write a review.



# Ford drops suit against counterfeiters and trademark infringers

Ford has dropped a lawsuit against 13 individuals accused of selling counterfeit products with the automaker's trademarks, according to The Detroit News. The company originally wanted to acquire names, addresses, telephone numbers, bank account numbers and emails from sites like eBay and PayPal without informing the accused, but a federal magistrate judge in Detroit initially denied the request, ordering the sites instead to notify its users.

Ford appealed, saying notification would allow defendants time to destroy evidence and possibly flee before Ford and its lawyers could obtain their identities. The judge eventually relented, allowing Ford access to names and addresses but blocking other personal information. Ford withdrew the suit last week anyway.

The Detroit News reports a 2007 U.S. Chamber of Commerce study indicated that Ford loses around \$1 billion per year to counterfeit auto parts. The report spurred the manufacturer to pursue offenders more vigorously. Counterfeit parts drag in \$12 billion per year world wide, with \$3 billion of that figure coming from the U.S. alone.

We have a fondness for the Forza Motorsport franchise, not only for its realistic driving physics but for the incredible of selection of cars and racetracks. If we did have one complaint, though, it's that there's a shortage of Ford Mustangs, particularly late model ones. In the latest variant of the game, Forza 4, there is a decent amount of classic Mustangs including the '65 Coupe, '70 Boss 429 and '71 Mach 1, and thankfully all of the Cobra R variants ('93, '95 and '00) are included as well.

As far as modern Mustangs go, however, users can only select from a 2005 Mustang GT or the 2010 Shelby GT500. Considering the aftermarket's involvement in the Mustang and how many street and race variants there are, we consider it a travesty that more of Ford's pony car aren't included in the game.

Forza Motorsport has rectified the situation somewhat, though, in their latest downloadable car pack for August that includes the 2013 Ford Mustang Boss 302. The car pack comes out on August 7th and is available for 560 MS points. You can watch the trailer below, which we'd like to point out has the Boss 302 leading the Camaro ZL1 for most of the footage including both cars.

The mule is also outfitted with a new steering wheel, taken from the 2013 Ford Fusion. The new wheel allows for more infotainment and connectivity options, which means that when its wired to a fresh, modernized interface such as the unit inside this mule, the Mustang will likely take a step forward in the user-interface department. The screen is on the smaller side, given the trend toward larger displays, but this model is also outfitted with a conventional button array, so something like an upgraded MyFordTouch interface may bring with it a bigger LCD.

The 6500 RPM redline coincidentally matches the redline of the 2013 Focus ST. This could indicate that the mule we're looking at is testing with a 2.0L Ecoboost 4 cylinder turbo direct injection engine. The Focus ST makes 247hp / 250 lb-ft torque.

The exterior shots show a mule without any sort of grille-work, giving us a peek a bit further back toward the powerplant. We've looked for obvious signs of turbocharging, but as far as we can tell, we don't see a smoking gun for the Ecoboost here. Ecoboost is rumored to be in the next Mustang's product plans, but word is that it will be the 2.0-liter unit, and not anything upsized like the 3.5-liter V6 Ecoboost engine.

There are also more photos of the Mustang mule's undercarriage, revealing the next gen's Independent Rear Suspension in detail.

Don't pay attention to the exterior styling as that's just a current Mustang body on the next generation chassis for testing purposes.







# Shelby American CEO John Luft: "We Have A Product Plan Through 2020"

Just ahead of the unveiling of the Ford Shelby GT500 Cobra tribute car at the Rolex Monterey Motorsports Reunion, I chatted up Shelby American CEO John Luft. We talked about the new 2013 Shelby GT500 Super Snake and the company's future without Carroll Shelby at the helm.

To say that Carroll isn't still at the helm isn't entirely accurate, though, and he won't just be there in spirit. Luft tells me that before Carroll passed, the two sat down and developed a "playbook" for the next few years, detailing future products and projects. Luft, who's been with the company over a decade, "used to spend four days a week with Carroll," will carry out the plan.

Step one, of course, is the updated GT500 Super Snake, now available with 750 or 850+ horsepower. With Ford's new Launch Control software and super-sticky Michelin Pilot Super Sport tires, Luft says this car will be able to put the power down where the old Super Snake never could. Launching at the same time is the updated GT350 (shown at right), which gets a styling makeover and a larger color palette. Luft also announced that a modified version of the Super Snake will debut at the 2013 Detroit auto show, though he'd say only that it would build on the performance of the 850+ horsepower model mentioned above.

Moving forward, the "playbook" has several pillars. The first plays on a number of upcoming anniversaries. He noted specifically the 50th anniversaries of the Daytona Coupe and the 427 Cobra, so it's likely we'll see homages to those cars in 2015. I can't help but think the 50th anniversary of the Le Mans-winning GT40 will be marked as well. Luft tells me that the turn-key car business is slowly recovering, but still isn't anywhere near where it was before the 2008 economic crash.

As it's long been, the Shelby brand is more than just turn-key cars. As Luft told me in a 2010 interview, the company has diversified its operations to include parts, a speed shop, and of course, licensing. The parts business has expanded to include Shelby-branded wheels, body kits and performance parts. Parts include Shelby-branded exhaust systems, a Ford Racing/Shelby-branded Mustang supercharger kit, and track and drag performance and handling packages. The speed shop, formed in 2010, is fully operational and is regularly tuning customer cars, and not just Ford products but other makes as well.

Of course, there's still a relationship with Ford to cultivate as well. According to Luft, Shelby used to say "when I go horizontal, I want

to be with Ford." To that end, Carroll spent many of his final years mending fences and reestablishing a connection with Ford Motor Company. The culmination was the 2007 Ford Shelby GT500, followed-up by the 2010 model and the new 2013 model, which Luft tells me Shelby spent five hours lapping Sebring in during its final development. With the relationship restored, Luft assured me that Ford and Shelby American are already working together on the upcoming 50th anniversary of the Mustang, though he wouldn't say any more than that.

While Shelby may be best known for his Mustangs, he worked with very different cars as well. In fact, he rather enjoyed it. "I got so much shit for building those little hot rods — Chargers, GLHs, and all that. I got so much crap in the press, saying 'Shelby's lost it, he's crazy.' I had more fun doing that," Shelby told Motor Trend in a previous interview. "It doesn't bother me very much if the press kicks the shit out of me, because I'm probably going back and build some more pocket rockets with Ford."

To that end, Luft tells me that he and Carroll discussed branching out to other Ford products, throwing out the Focus and Fusion in particular. "Ford's EcoBoost is absolutely it," Luft said. Carroll would agree. After all, he's been a fan of turbocharging for a long time. "I've been telling you guys, low displacement and turbocharging is the future," Shelby told Hot Rod editors after a GLH trounced an original GT350 on a racetrack in the early '80s. So while we don't expect the Shelby F-150 Super Snake to ever see production, a new, EcoBoost-powered "pocket rocket" with Shelby tuning certainly isn't out of the question.

Whatever the venture, Luft says the company will be a bit more conservative than it was back in the '60s. Back then, Luft says Shelby was operating on the absolute bleeding edge of the industry. Today, the company is making strategic decisions about the brand's future rather than just winging it the way Carroll did. It's unlikely, then, that we'll see another game-changer like the original Cobra, but there will be Shelby-tuned cars for years to come.





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
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
