



Ford executives confirm EcoBoost Mustang rumors




Rumors of an EcoBoost-powered Ford Mustang have been around for quite some time now, and why not? Ford has added an EcoBoost option to nearly every car, truck and SUV in their lineup, so it only makes sense that the Mustang would eventually get one as well. Now, according to Car and Driver, those rumors have been confirmed to be true.

During a dinner with Ford executives, Derrick Kuzak, Ford's group vice president of global product development, acknowledged that an EcoBoost Mustang was on the way. "Given the success we've had with EcoBoost across the lineup that we've talked about, it's fair to assume that we will have an EcoBoost Mustang in the very near future," he told Car and Driver.

So which EcoBoost variant would Ford put in the Mustang? According to C&D, the engine will be a four-cylinder unit similar to the 2.0-liter version seen in the 247 horsepower Focus ST, slotting in below the current 3.7-liter V6. And when can we expect the EcoBoost Mustang to make an official appearance? Car and Driver believes we'll see it in the next year or two, but we wouldn't be surprised to see it first appear in the next generation Mustang that will make its debut in 2014 as a 2015 model.

Chili Chicken Lime Tacos



- 1 whole cut up chicken (3-4#)
- 2 Tbsp oil
- 3 onions, chopped
- 1 Tbsp chopped garlic
- 3 jalapenos, seeded and finely chopped
- 2 tsp cumin
- 2 tsp chili powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 large can petite diced tomatoes with the juice.
- 1 lime

*Your favorite taco shells or tortillas and taco toppers! I used chopped tomato, sour cream, cheddar cheese and cilantro on mine!

- 1. Pre heat oven to 400. Place chicken on a baking sheet lined with foil. Brush with olive oil and sprinkle on a little bit of cumin and chili powder. Roast for 45 minutes. Allow to cool until you can handle it safely. Remove the skin, fat and bones. Shred all the meat.
- 2. In a large pan, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add chopped onion. Cook 3-5 minutes until softened. Add garlic, jalapenos, cumin, chili powder and salt. Cook another 3-5 minutes.
- 3. Add in cooked chicken and tomatoes. Stir well. Cook until hot. Squeeze in the juice of the lime. Season with extra salt if needed!
- 4. Serve with taco shells or tortillas and your family's favorite fillings!!!

Note This has a few peppers in it, but it is still a relatively mild dish. If you like it spicy, use hotter peppers!!

The "battle mode" design feature uses Facebook to fight it out for the most votes, and though there's nothing to win by putting the most-favored finishing touches on your favorite Mustang (the V-6, GT, Boss 302, and Shelby GT500 are all available to tweak), you'll walk away with bragging rights.

If you like your design so much you'd like to own it in real life, Ford can do that, too. A downloadable PDF is available once you've put together your ultimate design, listing all of the parts used. You can then take that list to your Ford dealer and see how far your budget goes.

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

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
