Recipe for March

Queso Fundido with Chorizo

Ingredients

- · Vegetable oil, for oiling the baking dish
- · 6 ounces chorizo or spicy Italian sausage, casings removed
- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 1 large clove garlic, minced
- · 2 cups grated Oaxaca or mozzarella cheese
- · 6 flour tortillas, warmed

Directions

Preheat the oven to 425 degrees F. Oil a 3 or 4 cup ovenproof baking dish.

In a dry medium skillet, saute the chorizo over medium-high heat until almost crisp. Remove the chorizo to a plate. Add the onions and garlic to the pan juices and cook until soft, about 5 minutes. Return the chorizo to the skillet with the onions and garlic and stir to combine.

Put half of the cheese in the baking dish and sprinkle with half of the chorizo mixture. Repeat with the remaining cheese and chorizo mixture. Bake until the cheese is bubbling, about 20 minutes. Serve with flour tortillas for soft tacos.

Ford to launch Shelby GT350 model in 2016, Mach 1 returning as well



Last week we reported that Ford might be dropping the Shelby GT500 in favor of the SVT Cobra for the next generation Mustang, but that doesn't necessarily mean that the Shelby name will be disappearing from the Ford lineup. According to our sources inside Ford, the company will introduce a Shelby GT350 model for 2016, a year after the next generation Mustang is launched for 2015. The big news is that the car will be an official Ford factory model, similar to the current Shelby GT500, and unlike the current GT350 model that is only a post-title package available directly from Shelby. Details about the 2016 Shelby GT350 are understandably scarce at the moment, but we hear it will be more of a stripped-down performance car just like in 1965, and expect it to be more affordable than the current model, which starts at just over \$58,000.

Another legendary moniker will be returning to the Mustang lineup in the near future as well, with our sources indicating that the Mach 1 is slated to be introduced as early as 2017. The Mach 1 name was last used a decade ago with a limited production run from 2003-2004, with the car featuring an aluminum block 32-valve 4.6-liter V8 producing 305 horsepower as well as a host of other performance upgrades compared to the base Mustang GT including front 13-inch Brembo brakes, Tokico shocks and stiffer springs. The look of the car was decidedly retro, with a function shaker hood scoop, unique 17-inch 5-spoke wheels and 1960s-style "comfortweave" leather seats.

Details about the new Mach 1 are few and far between at this point, but we look forward to the model making an appearance in the Mustang lineup once again and will share any news about the car as soon as we hear any updates.

Is Ford's Mustang Still the Movie Star It Once Was?

Ford's iconic Mustang pony car has been featured in more than 3,000 movies and television shows in its life, driving its way through American culture and cementing its position in the American collective consciousness. As James Bond, Sean Connery evaded a Mustang driven by a beautiful female assassin in 1964's Goldfinger; Steve McQueen drove a 1968 Mustang in the nine-minute, 42-second car chase in Bullitt; and an orange 1973 Mustang Mach I starred as the getaway vehicle in 1974's Gone in 60 Seconds.

Coinciding with the car's fiftieth anniversary and Ford's attempt to breath new life into its classic sports car, the Dearborn, Michigan-based automaker has agreed to let



the Mustang appear in Need for Speed, a film based on the popular Electronic Arts video game series. With the Mustang as the focus of the film, Ford will be able to target a worldwide audience that has purchased more than 140 million units of the video games during the past two decades, and, in the process, fashion the pony car as a cultural icon once again.

"We've been engaged with a lot of movies, but not to this extent with Mustang," Mary Ellen Abraham, Ford's experimental marketing manager, told The Detroit News in a telephone interview. "This is probably the biggest one we've done in the last several years. We see the biggest value with it."

Scheduled for release on March 14, 2014 — a month and three days before the car turns 50 — Need For Speed will feature a specially designed Mustang, with a custom-built wide body, 22-inch alloy wheels, and larger air intakes for the supercharged V-8 engine that will be under the hood. The film will star Aaron Paul of Breaking Bad, Dominic Cooper of Captain America, and Michael Keaton of Batman.

"Once we figured out who we were working with the story, we needed a hero car, and we came straight to Ford," Pat O'Brien, vice president of Electronic Arts Entertainment, told the publication. "There's no better iconic car to cross the country than the Ford Mustang."

Since the automaker unveiled the iconic pony car in 1964, more than 8.5 million Mustangs have been produced. With the first Mustang, the company even defined an entire class of American automobiles, known as the "pony car," which refers to a sport-car like coupe with a long hood. But time has come for a refresh; sales of the Mustang hit historic lows in the United States in recent years.

Ford's Mustang has lived a life full of twists and turns. "I remember when Ford Motor Company wanted to end the Mustang," United Auto Workers vice president Jimmy Settles, told AOL Autos in April after the longest-tenured Ford employee, Ed Salna, drove the one millionth Ford Mustang manufactured at the company's Flat Rock Assembly Plant — a ruby red 2014 convertible — off the assembly line. "I also remember when it was \$99 down and \$99 a month."





The Mexican Shelby GT350 You Never Heard Of

Among American muscle car collectors, the Shelby GT350 is pretty much the Holy Grail of Ford automobiles. Everyone knows it, has seen it, and desperately wants to own an original for themselves. As such, some of the wealthiest individuals from all around the world take to collecting these original Shelbys, though even we were surprised to learn that there was a Mexican version of this famous muscle car.

Jalopnik lays out how, in 1965, an intrepid Mexican car dealer struck an agreement with Carrol Shelby to import and build a small number of Shelby GT350s for the Mexican market.



Initiated by Eduardo Velazquez, in 1965 Shelby parts started crossing the border for use on the Mexican version of the Ford Mustang. Available only as a coupe and with the 302 cubic-inch engine, Velazquez managed to sell a few hundred of these unique Shelbys. Today they are a truly unique version of a rare car, making them doubly desirable to knowledgeable collectors.

It wasn't until 1969 that the Mexican GT350 got the iconic Shelby taillights, and Velazquez added a special 377 engine producing around 450 horsepower, but by then the market for fast Mustangs was starting to drop off. None were built in 1970, and in 1971 the Shelby GT351, with a stock 351 cubic-inch engine, was the only entry. It was sort of petered out after that, though for awhile these Mexican Shelbys dominated the local touring car circuit.

Now, most of these lost Mexican Shelbys are found in garages, remembering the glory days of dusty Mexican racing. As unlikely as it is though, we like to imagine that somewhere out there is a bandito with a tragic backstory driving his original Mexican Shelby from one small-town heist to another. We think that would make an epic movie.

The 1979 RSX Rally Concept Is The Coolest Mustang Never Built By: Raphael Orlove

What if I told you that Ford commissioned a two-seater Mustang rally car designed and built by a legendary Italian coachbuilder that history quickly forgot? You'd want that car, right? Here it is: the '79 Ghia RSX, the coolest Mustang that never was.

I wrote about the Ghia RSX a few days ago and lamented how little documentation exists for the car. Then Ford's Alan Hall emailed us with the original press release for the car, as well as the original press photographs. I promptly died of happiness.



The RSX stood for Rallye Sport Experimental, and the concept car debuted at the Chicago Auto Show back in '79. It had a stock turbo 2.3 liter four cylinder/four speed manual and stock suspension. The big changes were that the wheel base was shortened by 5.6 inches, the track was widened by almost an inch at the front and over an inch in the rear, the rear seats were thrown out, and it got a lightweight fastback/liftback body. And I shouldn't forget the super clean new 7.5" wide, 16" wheels wearing 205 55 VR x16 Pirelli P7 tires.

The interior was in black leather with red trim with a dash-mounted shifter like an Alfa Romeo. It's a little plush by today's standards, but I would road trip the crap out of this car. The doors were supposed to look like they were made entirely of glass. It's really just black plexiglass bonded over the door panels, but it still looks great. The stance might not fit with today's lower-is-better ethos, but for a road car with usable suspension, the RSX was mean.

Basically, it was my dream Mustang. It was sleek, efficient, and inspired by my favorite all-terrain race cars. I can look at this thing and dream about it racing against Alpine 310s, Lancia Stratoses, and Porsche 911s in rallycross. How hard would it have been for Ford to crank up the boost, tune the suspension, and make a credible Group B contender out of the RSX?

Most of the time when you hear about idolized Mustangs you hear about the 1960s cars - the '64 1/2 convertibles, the Shelby GT350s, the Boss 302s, the Kings of the Road. I respect and admire those cars, but my heart goes out to the light, cultured early Fox Bodies. More than any other Mustang, they seemed to match the European rivals. This RSX might just have been the ultimate Fox Body.

It would have been insane for Ford to build it in any considerable numbers, but good lord do I want one anyway.

More Proof The 2015 Mustang Will Have An Independent Rear Suspension

This photo, courtesy of Autospotters, is allegedly a 2015 Ford Mustang test mule with 2013 Mustang skin that shows what everyone's expecting from the next generation 'Stang: An Independent Rear Suspension.

We just received these images from a source close to Autospotters who says they're of a vehicle being worked on by a company that's been closely involved with Ford and the Mustang in the past. Specifically, the image below shows those delectable lower control arms peeking out.



While it's wrapped up in the body of a 2013 Mustang, we've been told it's actually a 2015 Mustang and it appears to match up with this vehicle shown in Car & Driver. The other sign pointing towards it being a development mule, besides its location and visual similarity to the vehicle captured by KGP Photography is the manufacturer's plate.

This just works as probably another form of confirmation for what we all know: The next Mustang is 100% getting an Independent Rear Suspension after an entire life with a Solid Rear Axle (but for a tiny period of IRS time with the Cobra).

Dropping the old suspension setup is a big deal for the brand and for fans of the car and, most importantly, for the critics who like to spurn the car for its "truck axle."


